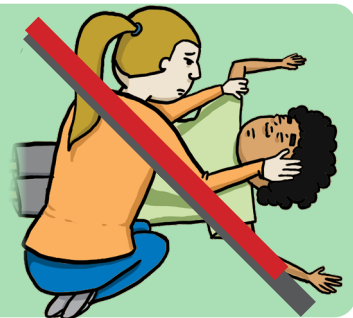

Seizure first aid plan

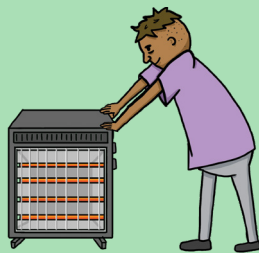
Convulsive seizure is when your limbs and body shake uncontrolled, when awake or unconscious.

1. Keep calm

2. Don't stop them shaking or try to hold them down



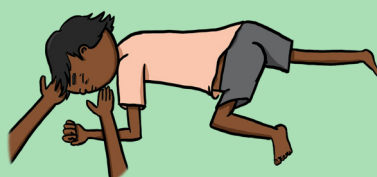
3. Move anything near them away, so they don't get hurt



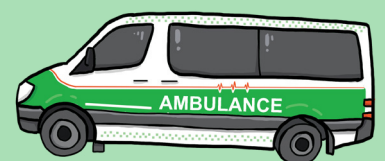
4. Don't put anything in their mouth



5. Gently roll them onto their side (recovery position)

If they stop breathing, or lips turn blue.
Stay with them till the ambulance comes

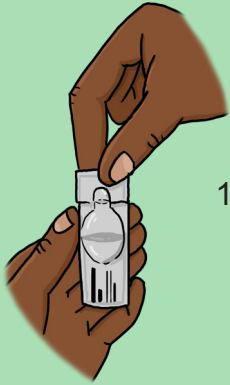


Give Midazolam if it lasted **more than 5 mins**

Buccal (in the cheeks) Midazolam
(buk-cal) (meh-daz-owe-lam)



Dose doctor prescribed.....mg ordrops
(5 mg of Midazolam = 20 drops)

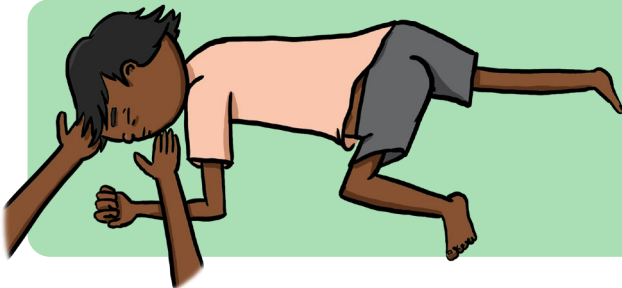


1. Twist tip of container



2. Empty unneeded drops using tissue. **Count them out**
This reduces risk of over dosing

3. Squeeze prescribed number of drops directly in between the gum and cheek. Give roughly half the dose on each side of the mouth.



4. After giving the buccal midazolam, place bub on their side. Follow your doctor's advice when to give a second dose and when to call an ambulance to take bub to hospital.

Talk to your GP, health clinic or pharmacist if you have any worries or concerns.
