

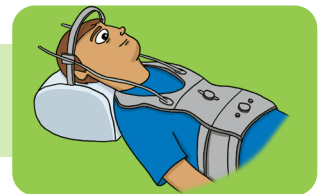

# Halo vest - teen brace

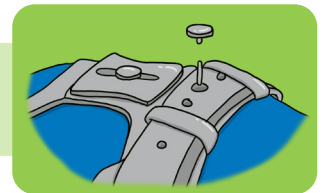
Only release bub's halo vest when there's an emergency.

How to release the vest:

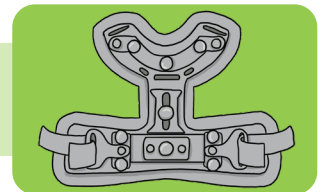
**Step 1:** Lay bub flat on their back



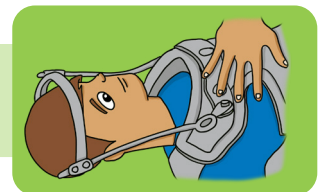
**Step 2:** Unscrew the bottom knob



**Step 3:** Undo the vest's waist straps on either side  
(lower part of the brace)



**Step 4:** Place your hand over the red line on the chest piece



**Step 5:** Bend the lower piece of the vest upwards, showing the chest
