Clinician alert #50 – all clinicians Effective from 27 March 2021

New information

• A locally acquired case of COVID-19 has been reported by Queensland Health

Information for travellers from Queensland

Anyone who has arrived in Western Australia since 20 March 2021 and has visited any of the affected <u>Queensland locations</u> during the relevant times:

- should get tested immediately for COVID-19, AND
- quarantine in suitable premises for 14 days from the date of attendance at the high-risk location, AND
- be tested for COVID-19 on day 11.

All Queensland travellers arriving as of 27 March 2021 will be required to have a COVID-19 test within 48 hours of arrival and quarantine until a negative test result is known. Testing will be made available at the airport for these travellers.

Other travellers should be tested if they have COVID-19 symptoms, no matter how mild, and isolate until they have a negative result.

Triaging patients presenting to health services

All health services should continue to assess people's COVID-19 risk on presentation, and clinicians are reminded to stay alert for potential COVID-19 infection especially in those who work in a high-risk setting (e.g. border workers, quarantine centre workers).

Testing is available at the usual COVID Clinic locations available on HealthyWA.
