The Research Education Program commenced in September 2013 and reaches participants from:

- all major hospitals, research institutes and universities in WA

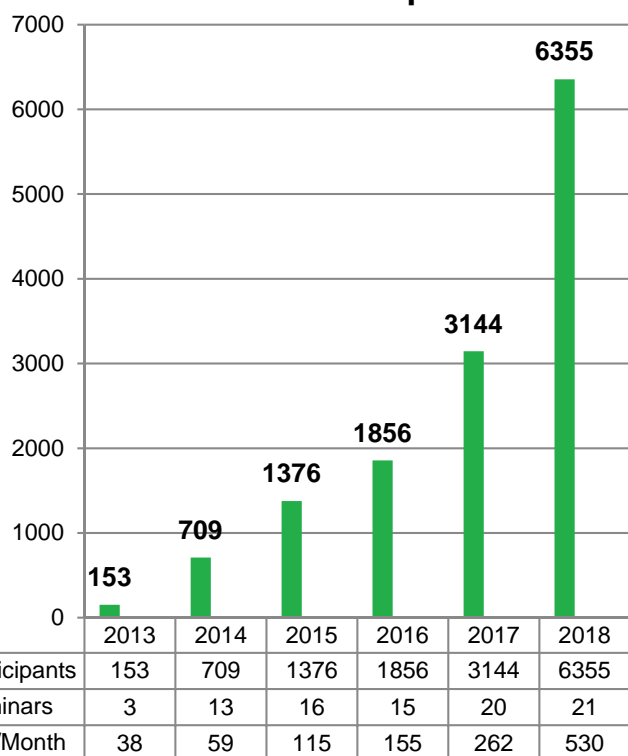

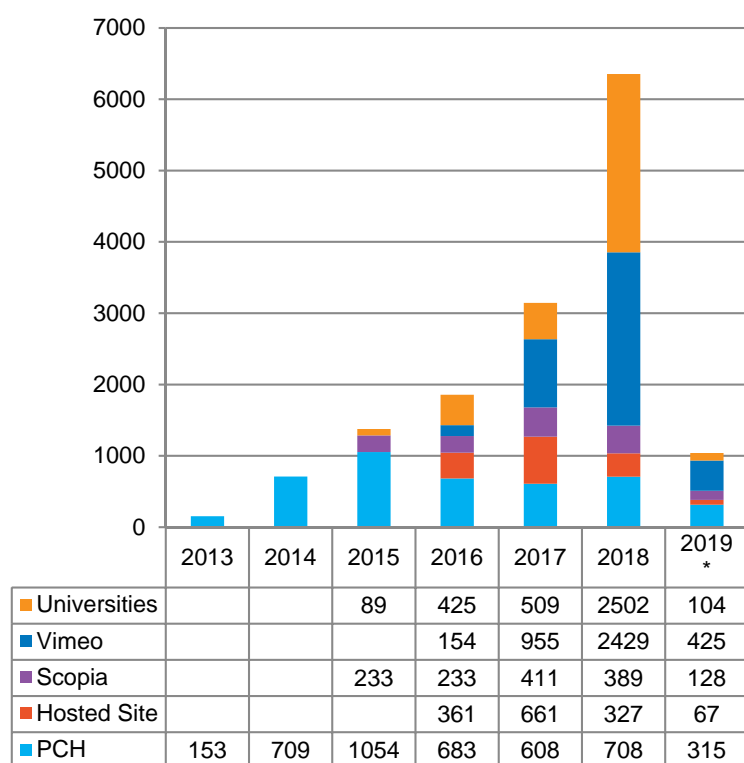
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Total Seminar Participants

Type of Participation

Numbers have increased from Hosted Video-Conference and Online Scopia participants as the demand for options to view the seminar externally has increased.

University collaboration has occurred with UWA Clinical Students since 2017 including embedding in community modules. University of Notre Dame since 2017, and ECU Clinical Students for 2018.

Additional Activity

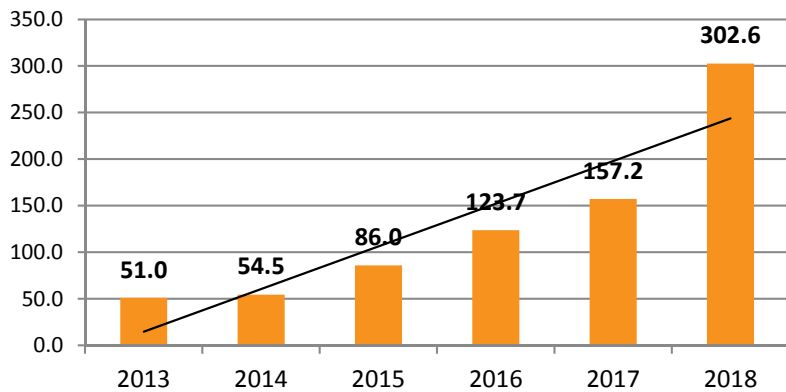

Evaluation

Each seminar receives feedback from attendees which is calculated into ratings. Over 5 years, seminars consistently average 4.4 out of 5.

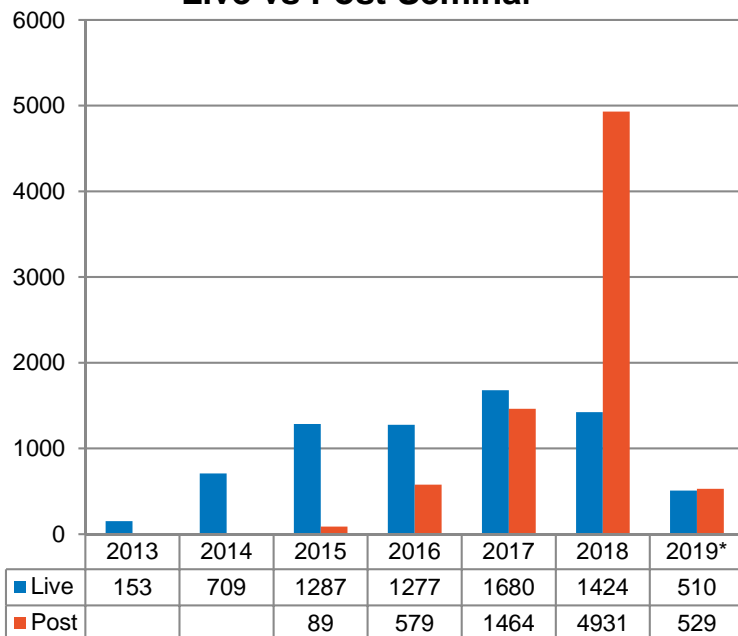
Average Participants per Seminar completed years except 2013
