

## Discharge advice Grommets

It is normal to see some clear fluid or blood coming from bub's ears 1 or 2 days after the grommets are put in, it should go way after 2 days.

## Keeping our mob healthy



If bub is in pain, give paracetamol (Panadol) or ibuprofen (Nurofen)
Paracetamol (Panadol)
Given at:
Next dose at:
No more than 4 times in 1 day
See packet instructions


You may be given ear drops when you leave the hospital, the nurse will show you how to use the drops.

## When to see your GP or health clinic:




If there is fresh blood or a lot of bleeding.

Ibuprofen (Nurofen)

No more than 3 times in 1 day

## While grommets are in:



Keep ears dry
Buy ear plugs from the chemist or use cotton wool with vaseline as ear plugs when bub has a bath or shower.


Keep head above the water
If swimming bub must not put their head underwater without ear protection.

If you have any concerns or worries after having the grommets put in see your GP or health clinic or call 64562222 and ask for the Surgical Short Stay Unit - between Monday to Friday 7am and 9 pm , after these hours ask for Ward 4B.
