

Lumbar puncture under general anaesthetic

Discharge advice

Pain relief

- Paracetamol can be given as every 6 hours as needed but no more than four times in 24 hrs.
- Next dose of Paracetamol can be given at _____.

Directions

- Activity should be kept to a minimum for the next two days.
- It is not advisable to participate in any sport or vigorous activity/exercise for one week.
- Your child will be able to return to school after two days.
- Leave band aid on for 24 hours.
- If the headache continues or becomes worse seek medical advice.
- If your child develops a fever and /or becomes unwell medical advice is required.

Care following anaesthetic

Food and drink

- When your child is tolerating clear fluids, gradually increase the amount.
- When your child is hungry, a light diet is recommended. Avoid greasy or fatty foods.

Vomiting

- If your child vomits, give nothing for half an hour, then start sips of clear fluids.
- gradually increase the amount when tolerating fluids.
- If vomiting continues seek medical advice.

Directions

- Should your child have problems passing urine, please seek medical advice.
- A responsible adult must stay with the child for at least the first 24 hours.
- Seek medical advice if the area where your child's Intravenous catheter was put in, has increasing redness, swelling or pain.
