



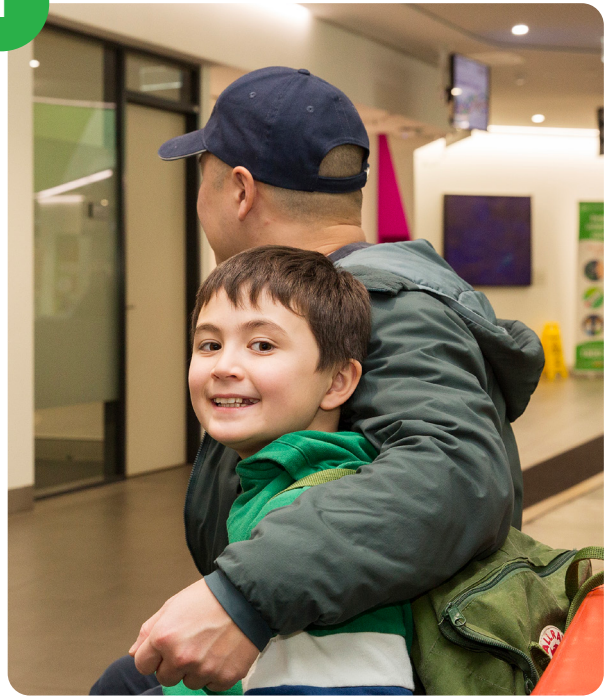

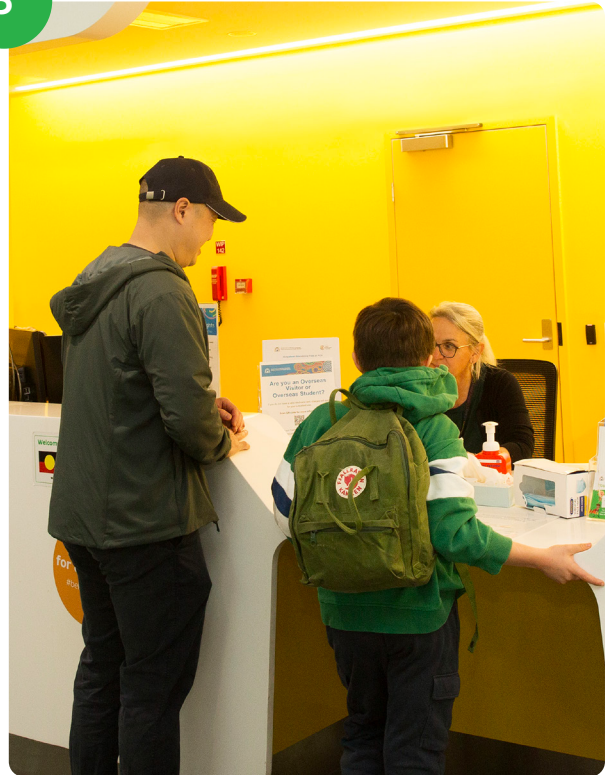
I am packing some of my

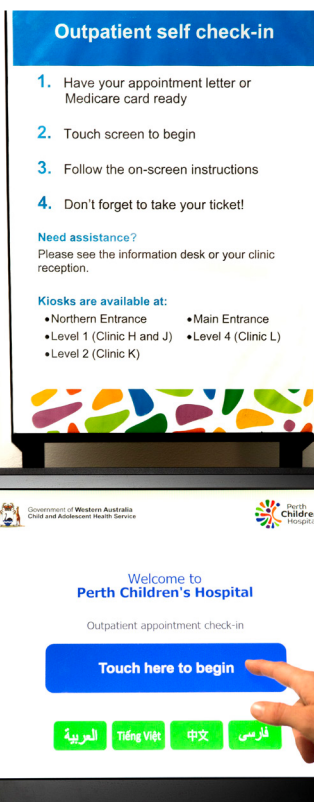
From ground floor,
