We provide free community health services to all Aboriginal children aged 0 to 5 years and their families, supporting families to raise happy, healthy children.

These services are available across the metropolitan region.

Our centres focus on healthy development, and identifying and treating any concerns early.

Some centres also provide additional services.



Note: In WA, the term Aboriginal is used in preference to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, in recognition that Aboriginal people are the original inhabitants of WA. No disrespect is intended to our Torres Strait Islander colleagues and community.

Child and Adolescent Community Health



What we do

We provide holistic health checks to children from birth to 5 years.

Your baby needs these checks at:

- **0 to 14 days**
A Child Health Nurse will contact you to arrange a home visit for this check.
- **8 weeks**
- **4 months**
- **1 year**
- **2 years**
Your baby can have extra support at 4 weeks (phone call), 6 and 18 months, and at 2½, 3 and 3½ years.

At each check, the Nurse might:

- weigh and measure your baby
- check your baby's ears, eyes, mouth, skin and iron levels
- check your baby's development
- give you information and answer any questions
- check how you are feeling, physically and mentally (your social and emotional wellbeing).

You can also contact our centres during opening hours if you're worried or have any questions.



Our services

We have teams right across Perth. They're listed on the back.

Our team includes:

- Aboriginal Health Workers
- Aboriginal Liaison Officers
- Child Development team (who help with things like speech and movement)
- Child Health Nurses and Immunisation Nurses
- Doctors
- Ear Health teams (North and South)
- Health Promotion Officers.

Our services

- **Aboriginal Health Workers**
Working with nurses, we provide child health checks and support for families that is culturally safe. We can explain the health care checks and any treatment or referrals your child may need.
- **Aboriginal Liaison Officers**
We can assist your family with social and cultural needs. We can advocate and work with your family, the Aboriginal Health Team and other services.
- **Child Development**
We can check your child's development, and provide early help and support. We can refer you to other services, like the Child Development Service, if necessary.
- **Doctor's clinics**
You can see a doctor at any of our centres. Ask your Aboriginal Health Worker for an appointment. See your regular doctor if you're worried about your baby's health between clinics.
- **Ear Health**
We do ear screening at primary schools. If necessary, we provide follow-up referrals.

- **Health Promotion**
Our Health Promotion team provides culturally sensitive information including workshops and at community events.
- **Home Visits**
We can arrange home visits if needed.
- **Playgroups**
We support local Aboriginal playgroups.
- **Transport**
We can help you get to and from appointments with us and other services.
